Math & English Proficiency Requirements

- All students must demonstrate math proficiency by a) an ACT math score ≥ 20 (SAT math score ≥ 500), or b) by passing a proficiency exam offered by the Office of Advising & Testing, or c) by passing MATH 130. Depending on ACT/SAT Math score, enrollment in MATH 125 or 130 is required **each** semester until this proficiency is met.
- Students must be enrolled at the appropriate level of ENG 120 or ENG 145 and then ENG 200 **each** semester until the sequence is completed. English class placement is based off of ACT/SAT English score.
